MOLESTON GRAVEL EXCAVATIONS

A good deal of activity here during the Summer between the Committee, our members affected by the excavations and Mr. Benson the owner.

The facts as known at present are that excavations are limited to the northern end of the pit, that end nearest to the railway tunnel, that working of the pit is restricted as follows:

7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays and
7.30 a.m. to 1.30 p.m. on Saturdays.

Preparation for working (e.g. warming up engines) will require to commence half an hour earlier and maintenance up to half an hour later on Mondays to Fridays and up to 3 p.m. on Saturdays.

We have spoken and written to Mr. Benson on several occasions concerning the activities in the pit, and we have Councillor Roger Martin acting as our link with the Local Authority departments.

We shall continue to keep this matter under constant review and will report any further developments.
